This my last will and Testament in manner and form following first I bequeath my soul to God that gave it and my body to the sea or earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executor and as to what worldly Estate if hath pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath in manner following that is to say I give and bequeath to Henry Gire of Gosport in the County of Hants, and to his heirs for ever all and every the wages that is or shall come due to me for my service on board the said Swallow Castle and all other sum and sums of money owing to me in the said ship upon any Account whatsover together with all my ready money and Apparel and I do hereby constitute and appoint the said Henry Gire sole heir and Executor of this my last will and Testament I do likewise hereby disallow revoke and disannul all and every will and Testament Gifts Grants and legacies whatsover by me heretofore made or will be ratifying and confirming this and no other as my last will and Testament by virtue of these presents In witness whereof I have hereunto put my hand and seal this fourth day of Aug: 1720. / Robert Samderson his Mark / Signed sealed published pronounced and declared as the last will and Testament of Rob: Samderson in presence of us / Alex: Speed Step: Jno: Smith: Doyle Clk: /

James Sotherby of Walton Barton in the County of Middlesex Esq: in consideration of my mortality do this twenty fifth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seven make this my last will and Testament in manner and form following (viz) first taking notice that the greatest part of my Estate is so settled that the same will descend upon or come unto my son James Sotherby in case he happen to survive me for which reason I now forbear to mention the particulars And whereas by certain Articles of Agreement bearing date on or about the twenty ninth day of April Anno Domini 1704 made or mentioned to be made between James Sotherby the Elder my honoured father deceased of the one part and Francis Howell of Bethnal Green in the County of Middlesex deceased of the other part the said James Sotherby the Elder my father hath thereby conveyed and agreed within three years next after the date thereof or sooner if he could conveniently to lay out and disburse the sum of three thousand two hundred and fifty pounds in the purchase of some Manour or lands of Inheritance to be settled upon Trustees as therein mentioned to the uses following (viz) to the use of the said James Sotherby the Elder for the term of his natural life and after his decease to the Trustees and their heirs upon Trust and confidence that they should permit me -

during my life to receive and take the rents issues and profits thereof -
 and after my decease to convey the same to such Child or Children of me or
 the body of Anne my wife begotten and for such Estates and terms and in such
 proportions as I should by any writing under my hand and seal testified by
 two or more credible witnesses direct or appoint how who or as the said
 James Sothby the Elder my honoured father dying suddenly did not make
 or fulfill any such settlement as aforesaid therefore for the fulfilling and
 accomplishing of the said Articles or settlement I do hereby in pursuance of
 the power to me given do last direct and appoint that the Manour and
 lands of Sowaldston in the County of Essex with the Tithes and Perquisites
 thereto belonging descended to me by the death of my father as his heir
 shall be sold conveyed and assured on Trustes; as by the same Articles is
 appointed to the use and behoofe of my son James Sothby and the heirs males
 of his body forever the parts chargeable with the sum of eighte hundred
 pounds of lawful money of England with the sum of eighte hundred
 pounds I do hereby charge the said Manour of Sowaldston with all the Lands
 Tithes and Perquisites thereto belonging to the said sum of eighte hundred
 pounds I do hereby give and bequeath to my daughter Anne Sothby and to my
 daughter Mary Sothby equally to be divided between them and I do
 likewise give and bequeath to my daughter Anne Sothby the sum of nine
 hundred pounds of lawful money of England I do give and bequeath to
 my daughter Mary Sothby the sum of nine hundred pounds of lawful money
 of England I do give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Sothby the sum of
 one thousand five hundred pounds of lawful money of England and also
 my moiety right and interest of an Oyl Mill situate near Kingslun in
 the County of Norfolk and of the lands thereto adjoining or belonging I do
 give and bequeath unto my son William Sothby the sum of one thousand
 five hundred pounds of lawful money of England I do give and bequeath
 unto my son John Sothby the sum of one thousand five hundred pounds of
 lawful money of England I do give and bequeath unto my most dear wife
 Anne Sothby all my Jewells Plate and English Books and all my household
 goods except my Italian Pictures and the Pictures of my family house of
 which Italian Pictures and Portraits of the family I give unto her during a
 her natural life but after her decease I give and bequeath them to my son
 James Sothby I do give devise and bequeath all my lands in fee simple
 not otherwise charged or disposed of by settlement of Marriage or otherwise
 to my son James Sothby and the heirs males of his body except that parcel
 of land called Danes field purchased by my self situate near Cambridge Heath
 in the Parish of Stoney in the County of Middlesex which said parcel I do
 hereby give devise and bequeath unto my most dear wife Anne Sothby
 during the term of her natural life but after her decease likewise to my
 son James Sothby and the heirs males of his body I do give and bequeath
 to my son James Sothby all my Roman and Grecian Coins and Medals and
 all other Medals and all my Manuscripts and all my Books of foreign language
 I do give and bequeath to my Uncle Thomas Gooding Esq. at Law to my
 Cousin Henry Balo and to Richard Ouslow Esq. of Grafton Garden twenty pounds
 to each of those three for Mourning and to each of my servants living
 in my house at the time of my death five pounds and to the poor to be
 bestowed on them as my Executors shall think fit the sum of Twenty
 pounds and I do hereby constitute and appoint my most dear wife Anne
 Sothby and my son James Sothby Executors of this my last will and Testament
 to be printed in one sheet of Paper and written with my own hand James Sothby
