Francis Snell of Delybrough in the Countie of Lincolne being
 sick in body but of perfect memory (blessed be God) doe make this my
 last will and Testament in manner and forme as followeth I give
 I recommend my soule into the hande of God my Maker and Redeemer in
 Jesus Christ, and my body to be buried in the churchyard of Delybrough
 aforesaid I give unto my sonn John Snell ten pounde I give unto my sonn
 Edward Snell ten pounde to be paid unto them when they attaine the age of
 eighteens years I give unto my daughter Alice Snell ten pounde I give
 unto my daughter Evely Snell ten pounde I give unto my daughter Katherine
 Snell ten pounde I give unto my daughter Elizabeth Snell ten pounde I give
 unto my daughter Margarett Snell ten pounde I give unto my daughter
 Francis Snell ten pounde to be paid unto them severally and respectively when
 they shall attaine the age of one and twenty years and not before provided
 that if any of my said daughters shall happen to dye before the age
 of one and twenty years then my will is that her portion who may first
 happen to dye shall be added to the portion of my youngest daughter Francis
 Snell but if any more of my said daughters shall happen to dye before the age
 of one and twenty years then my will is that her or their portion or portions
 yet living shall be equally divided amongst the rest of my children I give
 I give unto my brother John Burkit one ewe and lambe I give unto my brother
 John Snell one strike of hid and one strike of Dunbar the rest of
 my good and chattels unbounden my dette and funeral being discharged
 I do give and bequeath unto Evely my deare wife whom I doe make and
 ordaine sole executrix of this my last will and Testament this ninth day
 of November in the year of our Lord one thousand six hundred fifty and
 eight witnesses hereunto William Branston husband Snell.

 day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand six hundred fifty eight
 oath of Evely Snell his heire and sole executrix named in the said will to
 whom was committed administration of all and singular the goods chattels and debts of
 said decessor being first sworn by commission truly to administer
 4th October 1658

William Stapp of Killingsholme in the Countie of Lincolne being sick
 in body but perfect in Remembrance (praised be God) I doe ordaine
 this my last will and Testament in manner and forme following I give
 I bequeath and recommend my soule unto Almighty God and my body
 to Christian buriall and for my temporall estate I dispose as followeth I give
 I bequeath unto James Wakeham and Mary Wakeham the house of
 I bought of William Goodwin and his wife a piece of land I bought of
 Francis Mumbid to have equally betwixt them during the naturall
 life of the aforesaid Mary Wakeham and then I give it all and wholly unto
 James Wakeham with all the appurtenances thereto belonging to him
 his heire and assigns forever I give I bequeath unto James Wakeham
 two kine and eight sheep one bedstead with bedding belonging to it one
 new crasse with two powder dubs one sawer one chest one chair one
 little table and five pounde of monie to be paid within two years after my
 decease

I do devise, Item I bequeath unto Mary Walsingham one cowe eight shillings one halfpenny with bedding
 belonging, one best and five pound of money to be paid within two years after my decease
 as the other, Item I bequeath unto the said James Walsingham and Mary Walsingham equally
 betwixt them two acres of Barley and one of peas Item I bequeath unto Ruben Stapp
 the ffarme that was bought of John Compton with all the appurtenants thereof to
 belonging to him his heirs and assigns forever only paying forty shillings in
 the year yearly to his youngest brother Ellis Stapp out of it as long as he
 liveth Item I bequeath to Ruben Stapp six draught butle wares and wares
 of gold and plough gear, and to have half the profit as shall
 come the whole farm of what kind he will only paying to his brother
 Ellis Stapp and Mary Stapp either of them ten pound a year at the age of
 twenty one years or the day of marriage Item I bequeath unto Thomas Walsingham
 the part of the Looe I bought of Richard ffurrowe Item I bequeath unto Henry
 Walsingham the fourth of Henry Walsingham fourth shilling to be paid within four
 years after my decease Item I give and bequeath unto Ellis Stapp ten pound
 and one rowe to be paid when he cometh to the age of twenty one years Item
 I bequeath unto Thomas Stapp and Thomas Walsingham the ffarme called Genthell
 ffarme with all appurtenants thereof to belong equally betwixt them to them
 and their heirs and assigns forever Item I give to the poor of the South
 end of Killinghall six shillings and eight pence the rest or remainder
 of my good bequeathed my debt being paid, if there be any, and sundry
 expences distant of I give and bequeath unto Thomas Stapp and Thomas
 Walsingham whom I make and ordaine my equall and joynt Exorsutors of this
 my last will and Testament, And my will is they shall have half a
 year and tyme after my decease to settle or remove the said good In testimony

 Margaretten ten pound to be paid within four months after my decease
 Also I give unto my daughter Anne six pound to be paid unto her when
 she shall accomplish the full age of one and twenty years Also I give
 to John Manton my grandchild five pound to be paid at the age of
